One of my Hungarian 6th grade math students came to Mrs. Thompson and said he didn't think he knew Jesus the way she knew Jesus. He had been hearing about Jesus all year long and during Spiritual Emphasis week in January, he asked Mrs. Thompson if she could explain to him how he could know Jesus too. Full of excitement, Mrs. Thompson, who is over 60 years of age, led this young man to the Lord. The next class period, he came up to my Hannah and told her that he had just become a Christian. The word spread quickly that this young man now was our brother in Christ!

JR's good friend Beni who is Albanian, asked JR to lead devotions for a group of Eastern European finance leaders. **JR talked about Nehemiah and about how shared leadership means the mission is much more important than the position.** He talked about harmony in diversity and about how just as Nehemiah took initiative to lead, we need to as well. JR also had the opportunity to share these thoughts at the Global Technology Leaders meeting in Thailand. During his Thailand trip, he was able to share some insight regarding technical issues as well as gain knowledge from his fellow staff around the world.

My 8th grade Algebra class and I have been reading a challenging book by David Platt for devotions all year long. In May, the 8th graders will be donating

items we can sell at a rummage sale. 100% of the proceeds will be going towards a non-profit organization that the students will be choosing this month. **They have been challenged to pray for the world, read the entire Bible in a year, give out of their surplus, give some time to make the Gospel known, and to be a part of a local church.** The rummage sale will be a tangible way they can give out of their surplus.

In March, the chapel leader asked me to speak at the middle school chapel. I shared about how I came to know Jesus and most importantly, I shared how beautiful the words of the Bible are and how God's Word impacts our lives for eternity. It was a blast sharing Christ and God's word with my students!

My New Year's Resolution was to get a newsletter out every month—so forgive me for not coming through on that account. 


